Leaving a Legacy of Play

Choosing to remember Right To Play in your will or in your estate plans is a powerful and transformational commitment. Your legacy gift can unlock the infinite potential of vulnerable children around the world. Your planned gift could be the difference between a child unable to escape a life of violence, conflict, poverty and disease and one filled with health, safety, prosperity, possibility and hope.

What's more is that leaving a legacy gift is likely simpler than you think. Legacy gifts often allow you to leave a larger gift in the future than might be possible during your lifetime. Legacy gifts can take many forms. The most straightforward of which is to make a gift by will, also known as a bequest. Bequests allow you to leave a specified amount or percentage of the residue of your estate to charities of your choice. When you do this, your estate will receive a charitable tax receipt that can lower or even eliminate estate taxes.

Leaving a legacy gift to Right To Play is an important decision, so you should discuss your plans with your family and loved ones, and speak to your financial planner about what type of planned gift might be right for you, and lastly connect with your lawyer for help preparing or revising your will, or adding a codicil.

Once you have decided to make a legacy gift to Right To Play, be sure to inform us by completing the enclosed Statement of Intent form. It will give us the opportunity not only to thank you, but more importantly, it will ensure you learn about the incredible impact your gift will have in the future. Your Statement of Intent is not legally binding, but is an important signal for us at Right To Play that you have taken steps to make a gift in the future. Lastly, it will make sure we respect and comply with any instructions you may have about the privacy and confidentiality of your gift.
